Livestock Department, Section, and Class Specific Rules & Regulations. These rules and regulations are in addition to the "General Rules and Regulations Applicable to All Exhibitors and Exhibits". All Exhibitors must comply with all Washington County Ag Expo & Fair rules and regulations. Failure to comply may disqualify the entry and require that it be removed from the fairgrounds.

- 1) **Ownership:**
 - a. All owned animals exhibited must be solely owned and registered in the name of the exhibitor only by the breed association by June 1 of the current year. Entries received with papers pending will not be accepted.
 - I. Dairy animals in the Maryland 4-H Dairy Cattle Leasing Program must be assigned to the exhibitor by June 1 of the current year. The exhibitor must comply with the rules stated in the Maryland 4-H Breeding Animal Leasing agreement.
 - II. A dairy animal must have been owned by the exhibitor before the animal is 2 years of age. Cows in the Maryland 4-H Dairy Cattle Leasing Program must be assigned to the exhibitor before the animal is 2 years of age. Cows that were leased before the animals are 2 years of age, then purchased by the same 4-H member meet this ownership requirement and are eligible for exhibition as part of these rules and regulations.
 - III. Registration certificates for each animal must be furnished and available at any time during the fair. They will be checked prior to show day. If certificates are not in order the animal cannot be shown. Faxes of photocopies will not be accepted.
- 2) Any 4-H/FFA member exhibiting for the first time may have minimal assistance fitting their animal from their parents or an immediate family member. No other assistance in fitting will be allowed.
- 3) No adult assistance, other than one ring person (appointed by the dairy superintendent and 4-H Educator, and of whom is also a certified University of Maryland 4-H Volunteer) who will assist the judge will be allowed in the show ring during the show except for emergency situations. Lesser experienced exhibitors may request the assistance of an older exhibitor during breed classes if preapproved by the superintendent. No assistance will be allowed during showmanship classes. If the animal cannot be controlled by the exhibitor and assistant it will be excused from the ring. The judge will make the decision as to where the animal places based on their ability to judge the animal. An exhibitor must show their own animal in showmanship.
- 4) Exhibitors will be permitted to substitute 1 animal for another either in the same class or in a different class within the breed.
- 5) Superintendents may, at their discretion, break or combine classes.
- 6) Champion Showmanship class will include the current age group showmanship champions and previous years' champion showmanship exhibitors. The overall champion showman will be eligible to complete in the Champion of Champions competition if it is offered.
- 7) Showmanship awards are donated by Ralph & Terrie Shank, Palmyra Farm.
- 8) All dairy cattle must be dehorned and healed. For safety reasons, entries for animals not meeting these criteria will not be accepted. If any questions arise, a veterinarian will be consulted. Cattle with horns that were leased or owned by the exhibitor in 2023 or prior are granted permission to continue showing those animals. However, once those specific animals are done showing any additional new animals must be dehorned and healed prior to show.
- 9) A Best Bred and Owned Heifer and Cow of the 4-H/FFA show will be selected by the judge. The animal must be bred and currently owned by the 4-H/FFA exhibitor to be eligible. Exhibitors in the Bred and Owned classes in the 4-H/FFA divisions must be the breeder and the first continuous owner of the animal entered. "Breeder" is defined as the recorded owner of the dam at the time of breeding/service. "First Owner" is defined as the recorded owner of the dam at the time the animal was born. The Best Bred and Owned cow and heifer can be any registered dairy breed. A \$100 cash award will be given to both the exhibitor of the Best Bred and Owned Heifer, as well as the Best Bred and Owned Cow.

Livestock Department, Section, and Class Specific Rules & Regulations. These rules and regulations are in addition to the "General Rules and Regulations Applicable to All Exhibitors and Exhibits". All Exhibitors must comply with all Washington County Ag Expo & Fair rules and regulations. Failure to comply may disqualify the entry and require that it be removed from the fairgrounds.

Beef Cattle

- 1) Ownership:
 - a. All purebred heifers exhibited must be solely owned and registered in the name of the exhibitor only. Registrations must be completed by the breed association by June 1 of the current year. Registration certificates for each animal must be furnished and available at any time during the fair. They will be checked prior to show day. If certificates are not in order the animal cannot be shown. Faxes, photocopies, or digital certificates will not be accepted. Pending registration papers will not be accepted.
 - b. All crossbred heifers must have been tagged with an official Maryland 4-H or FFA tag and had the 4-H or FFA registration form turned into the Washington County 4-H Office (4-H members) or the FFA Chapter Advisor (FFA members) by the designated ownership deadline.
 - c. Beef heifers in the Maryland 4-H Leasing Program must be assigned to an exhibitor by June 1 of the current year. The exhibitor must comply with the rules stated in the Maryland 4-H Breeding Animal Lease agreement.
 - d. All beef steers must be tagged with an official Maryland 4-H or FFA tag on the designated beef steer tagging and weighing date.
 - e. Starting in 2023, exhibitors must determine which breed class steers will be shown in by weigh-in and tag-in in December. Registration papers will not be required for STEERS. The breed determination must be written on the livestock registration form that is turned in before weigh-in and tagging. Breed classes will not be changed after the livestock registration form is turned in. To be eligible for purebred steer classes the steer must follow the purebred guidelines set forth by the individual breed association. All other steers will be shown as either Exotic Cross or British Cross determined by lineage.
2. Breed classes for steers will be Angus, Hereford, Limousin, Shorthorn, Simmental, British Cross, Exotic Cross, and All Other Breeds (AOB). In the event 3 or more animals of one breed are exhibited in the All Other Breeds class that breed will move to having their own breed show.
3. Each 4-H/FFA member may tag 3 beef steers, show 3 steers, and sell 2 steers.
4. As appropriate, animals must be dehorned and castrated prior to tagging and weighing. For safety reasons, entries for animals not meeting these criteria will not be accepted. If any questions arise, a veterinarian will be consulted.
5. All beef animals exhibited must be tied in the beef section of the barn with both a neck rope and a nylon halter that sports a sliding chin piece. Any other type of halter, for safety purposes, will not be accepted.
6. All steers must be born on or after January 1 of the previous year.
7. All animals must be shown to be eligible for sale. Animals on sale day must be sold at actual weight. Champion and reserve champion market steers must be sold at the market sale.
8. Beef steers will be shown by breed and weight. Steers must weigh a minimum of 1,000 pounds. All animals will be weighed and divided into show classes at the superintendent's discretion. Number of classes may vary among breeds. Re-weighing will NOT be permitted. Steers will be weighed on the first Saturday morning of the fair at a time posted by the 4-H Educator. The 4-H Educator will post weigh-in times by the beginning of move-in on the Friday night entries start to arrive.
9. All steers and heifers shown must be 100% beef breeds, or combinations thereof.
10. Once a 4-H/FFA member wins the Overall showmanship champion class, they must continue to compete in the Master showmanship class. Overall champion showman will continue to compete in the Master showmanship class and will not return to their age division classes. The Master champion showman will be eligible to compete in the Champion of Champions competition if it is offered.
11. There will be no nose leads permitted during the 4-H/FFA beef steer show. Bulls shown in the breeding show that are weaned and not shown in the cow/calf pair class must be exhibited with a nose ring and/or bull lead.
12. No adult assistance, other than one ring person (appointed by the beef superintendent and 4-H Educator

and of whom is also a certified University of Maryland 4-H Volunteer) who will assist the judge will be allowed in the show ring during the show except for emergency situations. Lesser experienced exhibitors may request the assistance of an older exhibitor during breed classes if preapproved by the superintendent. No assistance will be allowed during showmanship classes. If the animal cannot be controlled by the exhibitor and assistant it will be excused from the ring. The judge will make the decision as to where the animal places based on their ability to judge the animal. An exhibitor must show their own animal in showmanship.

13. All 4-H/FFA Beef Department shows (showmanship, heifers, and steers) will be unfitted. This means animals can only be washed and blown out with NO adhesives, show foam, coloring agents, paints, oils, or other fitting aids allowed to prepare cattle for show. Exhibitors are allowed to use hair and skin products and conditioners (such as Revive and Kleen Sheen) as part of the regular daily grooming and hair maintenance of their beef cattle while at the Washington County Ag Expo and Fair. Animals may be subject to being wiped with a white towel, cloth, etc. as they report to the makeup area and show ring. Exhibitors are responsible for providing their own fitting chutes.
14. Exhibitors are required to tie their animals out at night. Animals are not to be tied to wash racks, etc. Animals are not to be out of the barn before 8:15 PM and must be back in the barn by 8:00 AM unless otherwise directed by the Washington County Agricultural Organization or the Washington County Youth Market Sale. Tie-out pen spaces will be pre-laid out and marked by the beef superintendent. They will be available to families on a first come, first serve basis starting immediately following the exhibitor orientation the Wednesday evening before the start of the fair.
15. Superintendents may, at their discretion, break or combine classes as they see fit.
16. Bred and Owned Classes: Exhibitors in the Bred and Owned Classes in 4-H/FFA animal divisions must be the breeder and the first, and continuous owner of the animal entered. "Breeder" is defined as the recorded owner of the dam at the time of breeding/service. "First Owner" is defined as the recorded owner of the dam at the time the animal was born.
17. Washington County Bred Class: Exhibits shown in the Washington County Bred Class may either be bred and owned by the exhibitor, or be purchased animals that were bred within Washington County, Maryland.

Livestock Department, Section, and Class Specific Rules & Regulations. These rules and regulations are in addition to the "General Rules and Regulations Applicable to All Exhibitors and Exhibits". All Exhibitors must comply with all Washington County Ag Expo & Fair rules and regulations. Failure to comply may disqualify the entry and require that it be removed from the fairgrounds.

- 1) Ownership:
 - a. All dairy steers must be tagged with an official Maryland 4-H or FFA tag on the designated dairy steer tagging and weighing date.
 - b. Steers may be up to, but not over 2 years old.
 - c. Dairy steers may be carried as a project for 2 years, but will terminate on September 1st of the second year.
- 2) Dairy steers must be 100% dairy breed.
- 3) All animals must be dehorned and castrated at least 60 days prior to the show and be completely healed. For safety reasons, entries for animals not meeting these criteria will not be accepted. If any questions arise, a veterinarian will be consulted.
- 4) All animals must be shown to be eligible for sale. Champion and Reserve Champions steers must be sold at the Market Sale.
- 5) Each 4-H/FFA member may tag 6 steers, show 4 steers, and sell 2 steers in a current year.
- 6) Steers will be shown by weight. Steers must weigh a minimum of 1,000 pounds to be eligible for the sale in 2023. Starting in 2024, the minimum weight to sell through the sale will be 1,100 pounds.
- 7) All animals will be weighed and divided into classes at the superintendent's discretion. Re-weighing will NOT be permitted. Steers will be weighed on the first Saturday morning of the fair at a time posted by the 4-H Educator. The 4-H Educator will post weigh-in times by the beginning of move-in on the Friday night entries start to arrive.
- 8) Superintendent's may, at their discretion, break or combine classes.
- 9) No show sticks allowed.
- 10) No adult assistance, other than one ring person (appointed by the dairy superintendent and 4-H Educator, and of whom is also a certified University of Maryland 4-H Volunteer) who will assist the judge will be allowed in the show ring during the show except for emergency situations. Lesser experienced exhibitors may request the assistance of an older exhibitor during market classes if preapproved by the superintendent. No assistance will be allowed during showmanship classes. If the animal cannot be controlled by the exhibitor and assistant it will be excused from the ring. The judge will make the decision as to where the animal places based on their ability to judge the animal. An exhibitor must show their own animal in showmanship.
- 11) The overall champion showman will be eligible to complete in the Champion of Champions competition if it is offered.

Livestock Department, Section, and Class Specific Rules & Regulations. These rules and regulations are in addition to the "General Rules and Regulations Applicable to All Exhibitors and Exhibits". All Exhibitors must comply with all Washington County Ag Expo & Fair rules and regulations. Failure to comply may disqualify the entry and require that it be removed from the fairgrounds.

- 1) General Rules and Regulations:
 - a. No adult assistance, other than one ring person (appointed by the dairy superintendent and 4-H Educator, and of whom is also a certified University of Maryland 4-H Volunteer) who will assist the judge will be allowed in the show ring during the show except for emergency situations. Lesser experienced exhibitors may request the assistance of an older exhibitor during breed and market classes if preapproved by the superintendent. No assistance will be allowed during showmanship classes. If the animal cannot be controlled by the exhibitor and assistant it will be excused from the ring. The judge will make the decision as to where the animal places based on their ability to judge the animal. An exhibitor must show their own animal in showmanship.
 - b. Superintendents may, at their discretion, break or combine classes.
 - c. Prolapses:
 - i. Lambs or sheep with purse-string sutures are ineligible for exhibition at 4-H/FFA shows.
 - ii. Any sheep or lamb that exhibits a rectal prolapse at a 4-H/FFA activity will be ineligible for the activity, and sent home by the 4-H Extension Educator, FFA Advisor, Sheep Superintendent, or any other appropriately deemed individual. The following will be used to as a guideline to determine occurrence of a rectal prolapse, "A rectal prolapse is defined as an inversion of the rectum that protrudes 4cm (1.6 inches) or more outside the body and remains exterior to the body while the animal is standing."
 - iii. If a lamb is observed with a rectal prolapse (by one of the above people) and in the future is not observed with a rectal prolapse, it is still classified as having a rectal prolapse. The was the criteria used in the 2003 multi-year study published in the Journal of Animal Science that established a scientific link between tail length and the incidence of rectal prolapse in lambs fed concentrated diets.
- 2) Showmanship
 - a. Exhibitors may use a market lamb or breeding sheep for this class.
 - b. The overall champion showman will be eligible to compete in the Champion of Champions competition, if it is offered.
- 3) Breeding Sheep
 - a. General rules and regulations pertaining to both purebred and crossbred breeding sheep
 - i. Ear tags must be in all breeding sheep upon arrival to the fair.
 - ii. Breeding animals must be shown in proper age classes. Lambs may not be moved up.
 - iii. Exhibitors are permitted to make only two entries in each breeding sheep class. Include ear tag and registration numbers (purebred) on entry blank.
 - iv. Exhibitors will be permitted to substitute a breeding animal within the same breed for another animal, either in the same class or a different class.
 - v. Senior ram and ewe lamb birth dates for all breeds will be between September 1 and December 31 of the previous year.
 - vi. Junior ram and ewe lamb birth dates for all breeds will be January 1-February 15 of the current year for early lambs, and February 16 and on/or before May 1 of the current year for late lambs.
 - vii. Rams may be brought in on the day of the show and will be released immediately after the show.
 - b. Purebred
 - i. All purebred breeding sheep must be bona-fide property of the exhibitor and must have been owned and registered with the appropriate breed association

- in the name of the exhibitor only by May 1 of the current year. A bill of sale or pending registration papers are not acceptable. Registration papers and ear identification of animals will be checked by the superintendent. No joint ownership will be allowed.
- ii. Purebred breeding sheep in the Maryland 4-H Leasing Program must be assigned to the exhibitor by June 1 of the current year. The exhibitor must comply with the rules stated in the Maryland 4-H Breeding Animal Lease agreement.
 - c. Commercial Crossbred Breeding Sheep
 - i. Eligible for all breeding classes.
 - ii. All commercial crossbred breeding sheep must be tagged with an official Maryland 4-H or FFA tag, and had a 4-H or FFA registration form turned into the Washington County 4-H Office or the member's local FFA Advisor by the designated date.
 - iii. Commercial crossbred breeding sheep in the Maryland 4-H Leasing Program must be assigned to the exhibitor by the designated weighing and tagging deadline. Appropriate Maryland 4-H Leasing Program paperwork must be turned in by the weighing and tagging registration form deadline. The exhibitor must comply with the rules stated in the Maryland 4-H Breeding Animal Lease agreement.
 - iv. Animals will be shown slickshorn.
- 4) Market Lambs
- a. All market lambs must be tagged with an official Maryland 4-H or FFA tag on the designated market lamb tagging and weighing date.
 - b. Per Maryland Association of Agricultural Fairs and Shows and the Maryland Department of Agriculture, all market lambs MUST be slick-shorn PRIOR TO ARRIVAL at the fairgrounds to decrease problems of club lamb fungus.
 - c. Exhibitors may tag 4 market lambs, show 3 market lambs, and sell 2 market lambs.
 - d. All market lambs must weigh a minimum of 90 pounds and not more than 150 pounds to be eligible for the show and sale. All animals will be weighed and divided into classes at the superintendent's discretion. Re-weighing will NOT be permitted. Market lambs will be weighed on the first Saturday morning of the fair at a time posted by the 4-H Extension Educator. The 4-H Educator will post weigh-in times by the beginning of move-in on the Friday night entries start to arrive. All lambs must be slick-shorn and dry when weighed.
 - f. Only ewes and wether lambs may be shown in market classes. All wether lambs must be castrated and completely healed prior to the spring weigh-in and tagging. A show appointed veterinarian will examine any wether showing signs of testicle presence, unhealed scrotum, or other stag characteristics and will have the final decision in determining show eligibility.
 - g. All animals must be shown to be eligible for sale. Champion and reserve champion market lambs must be sold at the market sale.
 - h. Grand Champion and Reserve Champion market lambs cannot be used in Department 4C, Section 12, Class 4, Pair of Market Lambs.
 - i. All market lambs must be born after January 1 of the current year.
 - j. County bred lambs must be bred, born, and purchased in Washington County, MD.
 - k. Bred and Owned classes: Exhibitors in the Bred and Owned classes in the 4-H/FFA animal divisions must be the breeder and the first continuous owner of the animal entered. "Breeder" is defined as the recorded owner of the dam at the time of breeding/service. "First Owner" is defined as the recorded owner of the dam at the time the animal was born.
- 5) Shepherd's Lead Contest
- a. The sheep (market lamb or breeding animal) must be fitted and trained to show on a halter.
 - b. The entrant will be judged on the mode of dress selected
 - i. The outfit must be attractive and lend elegance to the contest.
 - ii. The garment must be made of at least 60% wool.
 - iii. Entrants must furnish their own garment.
 - iv. Previously entered garments are not accepted.
 - c. The judges will use the following criteria for judging:
 - i. Wool outfit made or purchased. Credit will be given for home-sewn garments, hand knitted, crocheted, or hand-woven.

- ii. The contestant's own presentation and overall appearance (poise, fitting, etc.).
 - iii. Condition and overall appearance and attractiveness of the sheep (fitting, etc.).
 - iv. How well the sheep is halter trained and behaves in the showing.

 - i. A description of the outfit.
 - ii. Information about the animal being exhibited (name, breed, etc.).
 - iii. Other activities and interests of the exhibitor.
- 6) Wool Fleece - Any producer may enter one fleece per breed provided the exhibitor owned or leased the sheep at the time of shearing.
 - a. The fleece must have been shorn in the current year.
 - b. The fleece must be tied with paper twine.
 - c. Yearling fleece may have 12 months' growth.
 - d. Fleece must be entered by breed.
 - e. The fleece should be shorn from a sheep clearly representative of that breed.
 - f. Preparation - Fleece should be rolled properly, flesh side out, and tied with paper twine in such a way as to allow adequate handling, yet not affect the character or attractiveness. Each fleece must be tagged with the following:
 - i. Name and address of exhibitor
 - ii. Breed of sheep
 - iii. Sex of the sheep the fleece came from
 - iv. Number of months' growth
 - v. Fleece weight
 - g. Class descriptions:
 - i. Department 4C - Section 14 - Class 1: Purebred, Medium Wool
 - 1. Breeds eligible for this class: Cheviot, Corriedale, Dorset, Montadale, Hampshire, Shropshire, Southdown, Suffolk

All Exhibitors must comply with all Washington County Ag Expo & Fair rules and regulations. Failure to comply may disqualify the entry and require that it be removed from the fairgrounds.

1. General Rules and Regulations:

a. Ownership

- i. All market swine must be tagged with an official Maryland 4-H or FFA tag on the designated market swine tagging and weighing date.
- b. No adult assistance, other than one ring person (appointed by the swine superintendent and 4-H Educator, and of whom is also a certified University of Maryland 4-H Volunteer) who will assist the judge will be allowed in the show ring during the show except for emergency situations. Lesser experienced exhibitors may request the assistance of an older exhibitor during market classes if preapproved by the superintendent. No assistance will be allowed during showmanship classes. If the animal cannot be controlled by the exhibitor and assistant it will be excused from the ring. The judge will make the decision as to where the animal places based on their ability to judge the animal. An exhibitor must show their own animal in showmanship.
- c. Superintendents may, at their discretion, break or combine classes.

2. Showmanship

- a. Classes will be divided into and shown by exhibitor age groups. No more than 6 swine will be in the ring at one time.
- b. The overall champion showman will be eligible to compete in the Champion of Champions competition if it is offered.

3. Market

- a. Exhibitors may tag 5 market swine, show 3 market swine, and sell 2 market swine. The number may be reduced per exhibitor if the total number of swine exceeds existing pen capacity.
- b. As appropriate, animals must be castrated and healed prior to tagging and weighing. Entries for animals not meeting these criteria will not be accepted. If any questions arise, a veterinarian will be consulted.
- c. All animals must be shown to be eligible for sale. Champion and reserve champion market swine must be sold at the market sale.
- d. Market swine will be shown by weight. All market swine must weigh a minimum of 220 pounds and not more than 295 pounds to be eligible for the show and sale. All animals will be weighed and divided into classes at the superintendent's discretion. Re-weighing will NOT be permitted. Market swine will be weighed the morning of arrival.
- e. Market swine will be divided into and shown in the following weight divisions:
 - i. Super Light Weight
 - ii. Light Weight
 - iii. Medium Weight
 - iv. Heavy Weight
 - v. Super Heavy Weight
- f. All animals must be born after January 1 of the current year.
- g. Each exhibitor may show one pair of market swine. A pair may be owned by one or two exhibitors.
- h. Swine may be shown clipped, however, clipping must be completed prior to arrive at the fair. No clipping will be allowed at the fair.
- i. Washington County bred swine must be bred, born, and purchased in Washington County, MD.

Lesser experienced exhibitors may request the assistance of an older exhibitor during breed classes if preapproved by the superintendent. No assistance will be allowed during showmanship classes. If the animal cannot be controlled by the exhibitor and assistant it will be excused from the ring. The judge will make the decision as to where the animal places based on their ability to judge the animal. An exhibitor must show their own animal in showmanship.
 - b. Superintendents may, at their discretion, break or combine classes.
- 2) Ownership
 - a. All dairy goats must be owned and registered or leased in the name of the exhibitor by June 1 of the current year. Goats in the Junior Kid Class may either have a registration certificate or proof that an application has been made.
 - b. Dairy goats in the Maryland 4-H Leasing Program must be assigned to the exhibitor by June 1 of the current year. The exhibitor must comply with the rules stated in the Maryland 4-H Breeding Animal Leasing agreement.
 - c. All goats must be registered with an approved goat association and all exhibitors must bring the registration certificate and present those papers during check-in prior to the show.
 - d. Dairy goats must be registered solely in the name of the exhibitor.
 - e. Dairy goats must be purchased or leased by the exhibitor before the animal turns two years of age or before the first freshening, whichever comes first.
- 3) All goats must be provided with a collar and shown on a collar only. Prong/pinch collars are not permitted. Leashes attached to collars are not permitted in the show ring. All goats must be shown solely on a collar.
- 4) All dairy goats must be dehorned. For safety reasons, entries for animals not meeting this criteria will not be accepted. If any questions arise, a veterinarian will be consulted.
- 5) Artificial coloring may not be used on any part of the animal.
- 6) All goats must have a legible tattoo.
- 7) All does over 2 years of age must be in milk.
- 8) The base date for computing animal's age is the date of the show of the current year.
- 9) Two goats per breed, per class may be entered and shown.
- 10) Showmanship
 - a. The overall champion showman will be eligible to compete in the Champion of Champions competition if it is offered.
 - b. Showmanship will follow the ADGA (American Dairy Goat Association) scorecard:
 - i. Appearance of animal: 40 points
 - ii. Appearance of exhibitor: 10 points
 - iii. Showing animal in the ring: 50 points
 - iv. Total: 100 points

All Exhibitors must comply with all Washington County Ag Expo & Fair rules and regulations. Failure to comply may disqualify the entry and require that it be removed from the fairgrounds.

- 1) Ownership:
 - a. All breeding class purebred meat goats exhibited must be solely owned and registered in the name of the exhibitor only by the breed association by June 1 of the current year. Registration certificates for each animal must be furnished and available at any time during the fair. They will be checked prior to show day. If certificates are not in order the animal cannot be shown. Faxes, photocopies, or digital certificates will not be accepted. Pending registration papers will not be accepted.
 - b. All commercial breeding meat goats must have been tagged with an official Maryland 4-H or FFA tag and had the 4-H or FFA registration form turned into the Washington County 4-H Office (4-H members) or the FFA Chapter Advisor (FFA members) by the designated ownership deadline.
 - c. Breeding meat goats in the Maryland 4-H Leasing Program must be assigned to an exhibitor by June 1 of the current year. The exhibitor must comply with the rules stated in the Maryland 4-H Breeding Animal Lease agreement.
 - d. All market meat goats must be tagged with an official Maryland 4-H or FFA tag on the designated market goat tagging and weighing date. La Mancha market goats must have an assigned 4-H or FFA Livestock Ear Tag and the number of the ear tag tattooed in the tail web. At check-in, exhibitors of La Manchas must have the 4-H or FFA Livestock Ear Tag in their possession to confirm the Ear Tag number matches the tattoo.
- 2) Bucks will be brought in on day of show and returned immediately.
- 3) Meat goats will be allowed to have horns. Horns must be tipped blunt. Blunting (also called tipping) simply means removing the pointed tip of the horn. This can be done with a pair of hoof trimmers. Only a small amount of horn should be removed to prevent bleeding. For the safety of the exhibitors, sharp horns will not be allowed. The disbudding of market goats is encouraged, but not required. All male market goats must be castrated and healed prior to weigh/tag-in in May.
- 4) Prong/pinch collars will not be allowed.
- 5) Meat Goat Showmanship
 - a. Animals must be entered in market classes or breeding meat.
 - b. Exhibitors may use sheep or goat halters and collars.
 - c. The overall champion showman will be eligible to compete in the Champion of Champions competition if it is offered.
 - d. Showmanship breakdowns as follows:
 - i. 20% fitting of animal
 - ii. 50% performance in show ring
 - iii. 20% knowledge
 - iv. 10% personal appearance of show person
- 6) Market Meat Goats
 - a. All male market goats must be castrated and healed prior to weigh-in and tagging. If any questions arise, a veterinarian will be consulted.
 - b. All market goats must be less than 1 year of age as of the date of the show AND must have their milk teeth and may not show any breaking of either of the two permanent front teeth.
 - c. Each 4-H/FFA member may tag up to 4 market goats, show 3 market goats, and sell 2 market goats in both Section 2 and Section 3.
 - d. Goats entered in Section 2 must be 100% dairy breeds or crosses thereof.
 - e. Goats entered in Section 3 are those with 25% or greater meat breed genetics and are meat goat breed appearing. No dairy goats will be allowed to compete in these classes.
 - f. All market goats must be shown in uniformity short hair and have no more than ¾-inch growth.
 - g. All market animals must be shown to be eligible for sale. Champion and Reserve Champion market goats must be sold at the market sale.

- h. Market goats will be shown by weight. Market goats must weigh a minimum of 40 pounds to be eligible for the sale in 2023. Starting in 2024, the minimum weight to sell through the sale will be 50 pounds.
- 7) Breeding Classes
- a. General Rules and Regulations
 - i. No wethers are allowed to show in the breeding classes.
 - ii. Doe kids entered in 4-H/FFA market show may not be shown in breeding classes.
 - iii. Exhibitors may enter no more than 2 animals per class.
 - b. Full-Blood/Purebred and Percentage Classes (Registered Boer & Kiko)
 - i. All goats must be registered with respective breed associations (see general meat goat rules for more details).
 - ii. All animals must have a permanent tag(s) or tattoo that correspond to the registration certificate.
 - iii. Full blood and pure bred 15/16 or greater will show together.
 - iv. Percentage class 1/2, 3/4, and 7/8 will show together.
 - c. Commercial Meat Classes
 - i. 4-H/FFA commercial meat goats must be tagged at market goat weighing and tagging (see general meat goat rules for more details).

- d. The superintendent will send a form out in early July requesting information that will be used for penning assignments. All exhibitors must return the form to the superintendent by the due date to be eligible for the show.
- e. All pens must be utilized by rabbits on the entry forms for the show. Rabbits that are not entered for show are not allowed at the show.
- f. Rabbits will be entered at the livestock arrival times, and must stay until the animal release time. Certain rabbit breeds, including, but not limited to running breeds, giant breeds, and wool breeds will be brought in for day of show only. If you enter one of these breeds the superintendent will notify you of their penning status.
- g. Unused pens by an exhibitor will result in the equal reduction of rabbits allowed to show.
- h. Only exhibitors and show officials will be permitted within the judging area.
- i. Rabbits and cavies will be judged by ARBA (American Rabbit Breeders Association) standards.
- j. Cavies will come in for the day of the show and then be released immediately following the show due to housing conditions that may be detrimental to their health.
- k. Superintendents may, at their discretion, break or combine classes.

2. Breeding Rabbits

- a. Breed rabbits must be at least 3 months of age to exhibit.
- b. Exhibitors are limited to 20 rabbits total in breeding classes.
- c. Any substitutions must be made through the superintendent prior to the show. Any substitutions must be of the same breed, variety, and class and must be registered on the Maryland 4-H Poultry, Rabbit, and Cavy Registration card.
- d. A mixed breeds class will be provided and separate.
- e. Special Awards:
 - i. Best of Show Rabbit/Cavy – Rosette
 - ii. Best of Breed Rabbit/Cavy – Ribbon
 - iii. Best of Opposite Rabbit/Cavy – Ribbon
 - iv. First Reserve Rabbit/Cavy – Ribbon

3. Rabbit Meat Pens

- a. Rabbits can be mixed breed as long as they are still uniform in size, shape, and color. If there is a tie between sets, breed standards will be followed.
- b. Age limit: not over 80 days
- c. Weight limit: not over 6 pounds, or under 3.5 pounds for the show.
- d. All meat pen rabbits will need to grade in order to be eligible for the market sale. The judges grading decision will be final.
- e. Rabbits not within the weight limits may show, but not be Champion or Reserve Champion and may not sell at the market sale.
- f. All breeds will compete together.
- g. One entry per exhibitor.
- h. Meat pens may be purchased, or raised by the exhibitor, but regardless, must be in possession of the exhibitor by 8 weeks of age.
- i. Four meat rabbits may be purchased or raised by the exhibitor, but only three can be shown.

4H/FFA YOUTH CLASSES

- j. All animals will be weighed by the superintendent. Re-weighing will NOT be permitted.
- k. All animals must be shown to be eligible for sale. Champion and Reserve Champions must be sold at the market sale.
- l. Bred and Owned Meat Pens
 - i. One entry per exhibitor.
 - ii. Exhibitor must own the doe at the time of breeding/service.
 - iii. Doe must be present for the show
- 4. General Rules and Regulations for Poultry
 - a. Ownership
 - a. All poultry must be bona fide property of, and reside on the exhibitors premises June 1 of the current year. A Maryland 4-H Poultry, Rabbit, and Cavy Registration card is due to the Washington County 4-H Extension Office or the local FFA Advisor by June 1 of the current year.
 - b. Health Requirements
 - a. Any birds showing signs of disease will be refused and sent home. The decision of the superintendent, 4-H Extension Educator, FFA Advisor, or any other appropriately deemed individual is final.
 - b. Premise Registration – All Maryland poultry exhibitors must have a valid proof of a registered Maryland Poultry Premise ID Number with the Maryland Department of Agriculture.
 - c. Identification – All poultry being exhibited shall be identified with a state approved tamper-proof numbered leg band.
 - d. Health Testing – Refer to the most recent Maryland Department of Agriculture regulations for health testing that is required to exhibit poultry.
 - i. Documentation of health test results must be on appropriate MDA forms and made available upon request.
 - e. Self-Certification – All poultry exhibitors shall complete the Poultry Exhibitor's Self Certification of Animal Health. Self-certification forms can be found on the Maryland Department of Agriculture's website.
 - c. Exhibitors may show a total of 20 birds.
 - d. Poultry will be entered at the livestock arrival times, and must stay until the animal release time.
 - e. Substitutions made after the original registration of birds for exhibition shall be allowed within the same breed and class as the original bird.
 - f. The exhibitor will ensure that food and water is provided in adequate containers at all times while birds are on exhibit.
 - g. Egg entries will be judged during the poultry show.
 - h. Superintendents may, at their discretion, break or combine classes.
 - i. Meat Turkeys
 - a. Minimum weight for turkeys to be eligible to sell through the market sale is 16 pounds. There is no maximum.
 - b. Exhibitors are allowed to enter and sell one turkey.
 - c. Turkeys will be brought to the fair the day of the show (Thursday). Turkeys need to be in their pens and checked in between 8:00-9:00am.
 - d. Turkeys will be weighed upon arrival to the fair.
 - j. Educational Exhibits
 - a. Educational Poster (Class 0001)
 - i. Educational displays may not exceed the size of a standard tri-fold display board.
 - ii. Display information is expected to be in a member's own words. References should be cited. DO NOT copy and paste/print passages of text directly from references. Direct quotations should be referenced with use of quotation marks and indication of the source. Example: "direct quote." (Smith, 2017)
 - iii. Displays will be judged on accuracy and completeness of information, neatness of design, and educational value.
 - iv. Copyrighted images such as Nike, Coke, McDonalds, and or business names and logos, cartoon characters (Snoopy, Barney, Sponge Bob, etc.) cannot be used because they are protected by copyright.
 - b. Picture Collage with Story (Class 0002)
 - i. Collage may not exceed the size of a standard tri-fold display board.
 - ii. Collage should include no more than 10 pictures. At least 3 of those pictures must

- iii. A short written description of your project must be included. The written description should not exceed one page in length, typed.

Livestock Department, Section, and Class Specific Rules & Regulations. These rules and regulations are in addition to the "General Rules and Regulations Applicable to All Exhibitors and Exhibits". All Exhibitors must comply with all Washington County Ag Expo & Fair rules and regulations. Failure to comply may disqualify the entry and require that it be removed from the fairgrounds.

1) General Rules and Regulations

- a. Ownership
 - i. All horses and ponies must be bona fide property of the exhibitor by June 1 of the current year. A Maryland 4-H Horse and Pony Identification card is due to the Washington County 4-H Extension Office or the local FFA Advisor by June 1 of the current year.
 - ii. Equine animals in the Maryland 4-H Equine Leasing Program must be assigned to the exhibitor by June 1 of the current year. The exhibitor must comply with the rules stated in the Maryland 4-H Performance Animal Leasing agreement.
- b. Animals are to be brought in the day of the show (English or Western) and taken home the same day. No stalls will be provided for the animals.
- c. All animals are to be kept in designated areas.
- d. Riders are limited to showing 2 different animals for a combined total of eight (8) riding classes per day.
- e. Superintendents may, at their discretion, break or combine classes.
- f. Any horse substitutions must be accompanied by a vet letter and horses being substituted must have a horse ID card on file.
- g. The Maryland 4-H Horse and Pony Rule Book will apply unless specific changes are specified. In the absence of a specific 4-H rule, AQHA and USEF rules will apply.
- h. All exhibitors, English and Western, must wear headgear passing ASTM standards when mounted. Headgear must carry the SEI seal. Boots with heels are required when mounted. Harnesses must be secured and properly fitted.
- i. Exhibitors, both English and Western, must have passed Equitation knowledge levels 1 & 2, and riding level 1 to show in hand, level 2 to show in flat classes, and level 3 to show in speed and jumping classes.
- j. Age divisions:
 - i. Junior classes, 8-13 years of age
 - ii. Senior classes, 14 years and older
 - iii. Walk-Trot classes, riders who are in their 1st or 2nd year of showing.
- k. Riders entering in the Walk-Trot classes are limited to those classes, not including in-hand classes.
- l. Riders can only enter one trail class.
- m. Pony classes are only open to equines under 34 inches. Miniature ponies may not cross over into gender classes.
- n. Special Awards
 - i. Champion ribbons will be awarded to the exhibitor that has accumulated the most points during the day in the three separate divisions: Walk/Trot, Junior and Senior divisions. No Over All High Point will be awarded.
 - ii. Champion ribbons will be awarded to the first place exhibitor in both the Junior and Senior Grooming and Showmanship class.
 - iii. Champion ribbons will be awarded in pony, mare and gelding conformation classes.

Livestock Department, Section, and Class Specific Rules & Regulations. These rules and regulations are in addition to the "General Rules and Regulations Applicable to All Exhibitors and Exhibits". All Exhibitors must comply with all Washington County Ag Expo & Fair rules and regulations. Failure to comply may disqualify the entry and require that it be removed from the fairgrounds.

1) General Rules and Regulations

- a. Exhibitors will compete according to their 4-H Age: Junior (ages 8-10 as of January 1 of the current year); Intermediate (ages 11-13 as of January 1 of the current year); Senior (ages 14-18 as of January 1 of the current year).
- b. An Exhibitor may exhibit in a class above their age level, but not below their age level. If an exhibitor competes in an AKC, UKC, or any other similar sanctioned dog event, they must compete at or above that same level in all 4-H events.
 - i. First Year Classes are open only to Exhibitors who are in their first year of showing any dog in their respective section at the State 4-H level (i.e. Obedience, Fitting and Showmanship, etc.) 4-Hers who have competed in AKC obedience trials or professional equivalents in previous years may NOT be considered First-Year Handlers for 4-H Obedience Classes. 4-Hers who are regarded as Open junior Handlers by the AKC, as of August 1 of the current year, may NOT be considered First-Year Handlers for 4-H Fitting and Showing Classes.
 - ii. Good sportsmanship will be expected of all exhibitors and all family members. NON-EXHIBITORS SHOULD NOT APPROACH JUDGES. Address all concerns and questions to the show superintendent. The judge and/or superintendent may excuse from the ring or fairgrounds any dog or handler who falls into these categories:
 1. any handler who willfully interferes with another participant or their dog
 2. any dog which cannot be controlled by its handler
 3. any obviously ill or lame dog
 4. any handler who abuses their dog in or out of the ring
 5. a dog determined to be out-of-control
 - iii. When possible, except as expressly altered in these rules, the American Kennel Club (AKC) regulations will be used as the standard for judging.
 - iv. Eligibility: Dogs exhibited must have been trained by the Exhibitor. Exhibitor's project must be identified to the 4-H office by June 1 of the current year. Any 4-H project dog, whether registered/unregistered purebred or mixed breed, may be entered. All dogs shall be immunized and have a valid rabies vaccination. Rabies vaccination number and expiration date must be listed on the dog registration form. Dogs without a valid rabies vaccination will not be allowed to show. Female dogs in season will not be allowed to be shown.
 - v. The same dog may be shown by up to two 4-H members in separate sections (i.e. obedience, rally, fitting and showing). It cannot be shown in the same section by more than one member.
 - vi. Attire: AKC appropriate attire or proper 4-H attire.
 - vii. Awards: Premiums/ribbons will be awarded to 1st thru 5th place in each class. Trophies and/or prizes will be awarded to the Grand Champion and Reserve Grand Champion In each Section: Obedience, Fitting and Showmanship, and (Rally). TIES FOR THE TITLE OF GRAND CHAMPION AND/OR RESERVE GRAND CHAMPION IN ALL SECTIONS WILL BE BROKEN AT THE DISCRETION OF THE JUDGE.

2) Section 0001 - Obedience

- a. An Exhibitor may show 2 dogs in different obedience classes in the same age division (not more than 1 per class). A dog that has won an obedience class with an AKC qualifying score in a previous State Fair 4-H Dog Show may not compete in that same class again. Once a dog advances to a higher level it cannot move back to a lower level.

- b. All exercises will be done individually except the long sit and long down (these will be done in convenient groups).
 - c. 4-Hers who have competed in AKC obedience trials or professional equivalents in previous years may NOT be considered First-Year Handlers for 4-H Obedience Classes.
 - d. Class Descriptions - EXERCISES & JUDGING CRITERIA WILL FOLLOW AKC GUIDELINES AND RULES THAT ARE IN EFFECT AS OF JANUARY 1 OF CURRENT YEAR, UNLESS MODIFIED AND PUBLISHED IN THE CURRENT STATE FAIR CATALOGUE.
 - i. Sub-Novice Obedience: Dogs that have earned one leg toward AKC CD title or other professional equivalent are not eligible for 4-H Sub-Novice Obedience classes. All work will be done on a 6' leash. Exercises include: 1. Heel on Leash, 2. Figure 8 (on leash), 3. Stand for Exam (on leash), 4. Recall (on leash), 5. Long Sit (on leash), 6. Long Down (on leash).
 - ii. First Year Beginner Novice Obedience: Dogs that have earned one leg toward AKC CD 4-H/FFA YOUTH CLASS Washington County Ag Expo 2023 title or other professional equivalent are not eligible for 4-H Beginner Novice Obedience classes. Exercises include: 1. Heel on Leash, 2. Figure Eight (on leash), 3. Sit for Exam (on leash-dropped), 4. Sit Stay (on leash - dropped), 5. Recall (on leash).
 - iii. Beginner Novice Obedience: Dogs that have earned one leg toward AKC CD title or other professional equivalent are not eligible for 4-H Beginner Novice Obedience classes. Exercises include: 1. Heel on Leash, 2. Figure Eight (on leash), 3. Sit for Exam (on leash - dropped), 4. Sit Stay (on leash - dropped), 5. Recall (off leash).
 - iv. Novice Obedience: Dogs that have earned an AKC CD title or other professional equivalent title are not eligible for 4-H Novice Obedience classes. Exercises include: 1. Heel on Leash and Figure Eight, 2. Stand for Examination (off leash), 3. Heel Free (off leash), 4. Recall (off leash), 5. Sit Stay - Get Your Leash 6. Long Sit (off leash), 7. Long Down (off leash).
 - v. Graduate Novice Obedience: Dogs which have not obtained one (1) leg toward CDX title from the AKC or an equivalent title from another registry but have obtained a CD title from the AKC or an equivalent title from another registry are eligible to compete in this class. Exercises include: 1. Heel Free and Figure Eight, 2. Drop On Recall (off leash), 3. Dumbbell Recall (off leash), 4. Recall over High Jump (off leash), 5. Recall over Broad Jump (off leash), 6. Stay - Get Your Leash (Sit, Down) (off leash).
 - vi. Open Obedience: These classes represent advanced obedience and any Exhibitor who has trained a dog to complete the respective class exercises may compete in this class. All entries in the open classes must indicate the appropriate dog jump heights (Open-High and Broad). Exercises include: 1. Heel Free and Figure Eight (off leash), 2. Command Discrimination (Stand, Down, Sit), 3. Drop on Recall (off leash), 4. Retrieve on Flat (off leash), 5. Retrieve over High Jump (off leash), 6. Broad Jump (off leash), 7. Stay - Get Your Leash (Sit, Down).
 - 1. Exhibitors who are showing at this level may continue showing at this level indefinitely.
 - 2. For Exhibition Only (FEO) Status: Exhibitors that have earned an AKC CDX (or equivalent) on the dog they are entering in this fair may only participate in the Open class as FEO.
- 3) Section 0002 - Fitting and Showmanship
- a. All fitting (grooming) must be done by the Exhibitor except where help is needed with specialized breed grooming (e.g. clipping, stripping). Artificial preparations such as powder or cornstarch may NOT be left on the dog. Refer to the "4-H and FFA Fitting & Showmanship Regulations".
 - b. Dogs must be clean (including their ears) with coats well brushed and free of mats. Dogs should be free of external parasites. Allowances may be made by the judge for unavoidable surface dirt due to wet weather. Artificial preparation such as powder or cornstarch, etc. may NOT be left on the dog.

4H/FFA YOUTH CLASSES

- c. Exhibitors should be able to show their dogs at an appropriate gait, show the dog's bite upon judge's request, stand their dogs in an acceptable pose to permit examination by judge. Exhibitors should be able to answer questions on care, grooming, and background of their breed(s).
 - d. 4-H Fitting and Showing exhibitors who are regarded as Open junior Handlers by the AKC, as of July 1 of the current year, may NOT be considered First-Year Handlers for 4-H Fitting and Showing Classes.
 - e. Fitting of Dog (body condition, grooming) and Showing in the Ring (performance of dog, presentation of dog, alertness of exhibitor, personal appearance of the exhibitor, and knowledge of dog) will be judged.
 - f. Performance of the dog shall not count against the Exhibitor unless in the Judge's opinion it interferes with another exhibitor's dog. The ability of the exhibitor to show their dog to its best advantage, whether the dog is cooperating or not, will be evaluated. It is expected that the exhibitor will have worked with their dog adequately prior to the show and have developed a working relationship with the dog.
 - g. Class Descriptions – please read the following class descriptions very carefully.
 - i. First Year Novice: Exhibitors who are in their first year of showing any dog in State 4-H Fitting and Showing classes.
 - ii. Novice: Exhibitors (Handlers) who have previously placed 1st in a Novice Fitting & Showmanship class are not eligible for this class and must compete in the appropriate Open Fitting & Showmanship class. Exception - 1st year Fitting & Showmanship Exhibitors who are regarded as Open Junior Handlers by the AKC, as of August 1 of the current year, are 4-H/FFA YOUTH CLASS Washington County Ag Expo 2023 not eligible for this class.
 - iii. Open: This class represents advanced fitting & showmanship. Local 4-H Extension Educators may pre-enter any 4-H Member in an Open Fitting & Showmanship class regardless of exhibitor's experience. Once an exhibitor competes in an Open Fitting & Showmanship class they may not compete in a Novice Fitting & Showmanship class at a future State 4-H Fair Dog Show. Exhibitors should be able to show their dogs at an appropriate gait, show the dog's bite upon judge's request and stand their dogs in an acceptable pose to permit examination by judge.
 - h. Exhibitors should be able to answer questions on the care, grooming, and background of their breed(s).
 - i. Fitting of Dog (body condition, grooming) and Showing in the Ring (performance of dog, presentation of dog, alertness of exhibitor, personal appearance of the exhibitor, and knowledge of the breed and overall dog care and training) will be judged.
 - j. Performance of the dog shall not count against the Exhibitor unless in the Judge's opinion it interferes with another exhibitor's dog. The ability of the exhibitor to show their dog to its best advantage, whether the dog is cooperative or not, will be evaluated. It is expected that the exhibitor will have worked with their dog adequately prior to the show and have developed a working relationship with the dog.
- 4) Section 0003 – Rally
- a. An exhibitor may show 2 dogs in different Rally classes in the same age division (not more than 1 per class). A dog that has won a Rally class in a previous State Fair 4-H Dog Show may not compete in that same class again. The dog must move up to a higher Rally class (i.e. Novice to Advanced) or the Exhibitor must move to the next age level (i.e. Junior to Intermediate). Advancement will be at the discretion of the Local 4-H Dog Project Leader. Once a dog advances to a higher level it cannot move back to a lower level.
 - b. All course runs will be done individually.
 - c. Exercises and Judging Criteria for all divisions will follow AKC rules that are in effect as of January 1 of the current year.
 - i. Novice Rally: Dogs which have earned their RN (Rally Novice) title from AKC or an equivalent title from another registry may not compete in this class. All work will be done on lead.
 - ii. Intermediate Rally: Dogs which have earned their RI (Rally Intermediate) title from AKC or an equivalent title from another registry may not compete in this class. All work will be done on lead.

- iii. Advanced Rally: Dogs which have earned their RA (Rally Advanced) title from AKC or an equivalent title from another registry may not compete in this class. All work will be done off leash.
- iv. Excellent A Rally: Dogs which have won this class, with a qualifying score in prior years, or have earned their RE (Rally Excellent) title from AKC or an equivalent title from another registry may not compete in this class. All work, with the exception of the Honor Exercises will be done off leash.
- v. Excellent B Rally: For dogs that have won Excellent A class at the State Fair in prior years, with a qualifying score or have the AKC RE (Rally Excellent) title. All work with the exception of the Honor Exercise, is done off-leash.

1) General Rules and Regulations

- a. Proper USDA canning and preservation methods must be used.
- b. Jars that become unsealed during the fair will be discarded and the premium forfeited.
- c. All canned and preserved products must be exhibited in clean, clear standard canning jars, quart or pint size and jellies in half pint/pint glasses with screw band lid.
 - i. Lids must be rust free and jars must be dust free.
- d. Judges **WILL NOT** open jars of canned foods when judging.
- e. Food coloring may not be added to canned products.
- f. No jar may be exhibited more than once.
- g. Soft spread definitions:
 - i. Jelly – made from strained fruit juice and sugar cooked together. Jelly is crystal clear and shimmering: firm enough to hold its shape outside the jar, yet soft enough to spread easily.
 - ii. Jam – Made by cooking crushed or chopped fruit with sugar. Jams can be made from one fruit or a combination of fruits. They should be firm but spread easily; jams do not hold the shape of the jar.
 - iii. Butter – made by cooking fruit pulp and sugar to a thick consistency that will spread easily. Spices may be added.
 - iv. Preserves – made by cooking fruit and sugar so that the fruit retains its shape, is clear, shiny, tender, and plump. The syrup is clear and varies from the thickness of honey to that of soft jelly.
 - v. Conserves – jam-like products made by cooking two or more fruits with sugar. A true conserve contains raisins and nuts.
 - vi. Marmalades – soft-fruit jellies containing small pieces of fruit and citrus peel evenly suspended in the transparent jelly. They are similar in structure to jams.

 - b. **No frosting made with raw eggs, cream cheese, or other ingredients requiring refrigeration. Please see below for the suggested frosting recipe.**
 - c. Items must be exhibited on a sturdy, white, disposable plate placed into a ziploc-type bag.
 - d. Exhibits that are too large for a ziploc-type bag may be covered with clear plastic wrap.
 - e. All Champion and Reserve Champion baked goods exhibited will be sold at the 4-H cake auction. 1st and 2nd place exhibits will be sold at the baked goods table in the Home Arts building on entry/judging day and Friday.
 - f. No commercial mixes or convenience foods are to be used for classes 40-1-4 through 40-1-16.
 - g. The recipe must be included with all baked items, written on a 4x6 card and attached to the item.
- 2) Cookies
 - a. Definitions of cookie types:
 - i. Bar – stiff dough spread in a flat pan, baked, cooled, and cut into bars.
 - ii. Drop – soft dough dropped from a spoon onto a cookie sheet.
 - iii. Rolled – stiff dough rolled thin and cut into the desired shape.
 - iv. Refrigerator – stiff dough shaped into rolls, wrapped, chilled well in the refrigerator, then cut into thin slices.
 - v. Molded – stiff dough rolled between hands into balls, logs, crescents, etc.
 - vi. Pressed – dough forced through a cookie press/pastry tube into various shapes
 - b. Exhibits consist of 8 cookies.
 - c. Class 40-2-13: Boxed Cookie Mix with Added Ingredient - Exhibitor must use a boxed cookie mix as the base, then add fruit, nuts, pudding, chocolate chips, or other ingredients to the mix. At least one added ingredient must be used.
 - d. Class 40-2-14: Made with Boxed Cake Mix and Added Ingredient(s) – Exhibitor must use a boxed cake mix as the base and then add ingredients to make cookies.
- 3) Cakes
 - a. A whole cake makes an exhibit.
 - b. Cupcake exhibits consist of 8 cupcakes.
 - c. Cakes must be exhibited on stiff cardboard 2" larger than the cake and covered with clear plastic wrap.
 - d. Class 40-1-17: Cake Made with Cake Mix – Exhibitor must use a boxed cake mix as the base, then add fruit, nuts, pudding, chocolate chips, or other ingredients to the mix. More than one ingredient must be added.
- 4) Candy
 - a. Exhibits consist of 8 pieces of candy.
 - b. Fudge must be cut into 1" square pieces.
- 5) Breads
 - a. Exhibits consist of a whole loaf of bread or 8 rolls, muffins, or biscuits.
 - b. All exhibits must be placed on a white, sturdy, 9" disposable plate.
 - c. All bread exhibits must be the whole loaf wrapped well with clear plastic wrap.
- 6) Pies
 - a. Exhibits must be in a disposable, 9" pie pan and covered well with clear plastic wrap.

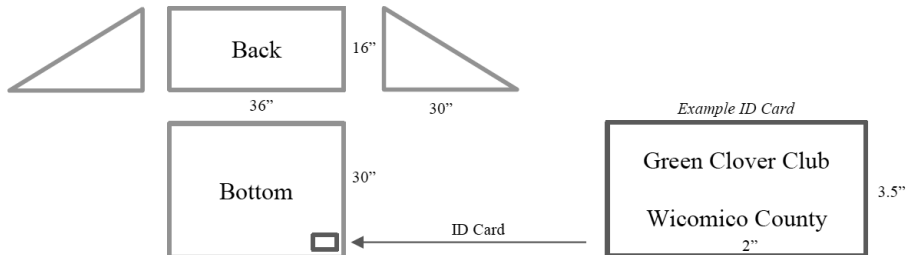

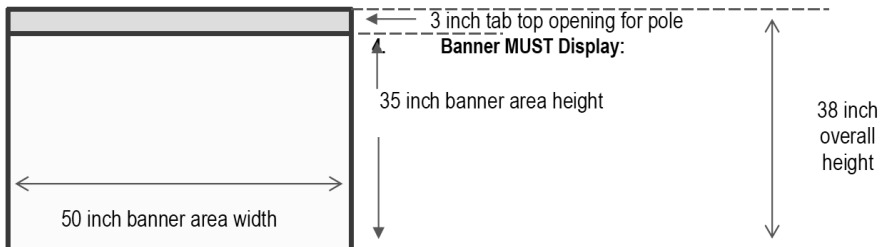
- 1) All exhibits must relate to and promote 4-H or FFA. Cartoon figures, such as Spongebob, Bart Simpson, etc., cannot be used since they are copyrighted.
- 2) Booths, banners, posters and scrapbooks must primarily be the work of club or chapter members. Parents, leaders, and advisors may supervise and assist with the design, but may not do a significant portion of the construction.
- 3) Exhibits previously entered in the Ag Expo and Fair are not allowed. Booth frames, etc. may be reused.
- 4) All booths, banners, posters and scrapbooks must be constructed to be displayed for the entire length of the Ag Expo and Fair.
- 5) Clubs/Chapters need to enter themselves using the online entry system. Once account should be created per club/chapter, this account will be for club/chapter entries only. The contact information should be the club leader or chapter advisor.
 - a. To create an account, use the club name as the first name and "4-H Club" or "FFA Chapter" as the last name. Example:
- 6) Green Clover 4-H Club
- 7) First name: Green Clover
- 8) Last Name: 4-H Club
- 9) 4-H Club/FFA Chapter Booths
- 10) Each 4-H Club/FFA Chapter may enter 1 Booth.
- 11) Classes: There are two classes offered:
 - a. Annual-Theme: Use the following theme for 2023: "4-H Friendships"
 - b. Open-Theme: May feature any theme promoting 4-H/FFA.
- 12) Size and Construction:

- 14) Booth Details:
 - a. Nothing in the booth may be taller than the sides of the booth where the item is placed.
 - b. No Electrical hookups will be provided.
 - c. Structure **MUST** be constructed of durable materials that will look good for the duration of the fair.
 - d. Booth items **MUST** be securely fastened to prevent damage, loss or to prevent items from shifting if moved. Booths are often relocated after they are dropped off, if items shift due to poor design they will be left where they fall.
 - e. Failure to comply with these instructions may cause the booth to receive a deduction in score or disqualified and not receive a premium.
